Don't judge the paper by its cover: Affiliation bias in conference admissions.

Abstract: Building and maintaining professional networks is crucial for young researchers, with academic conferences serving as vital platforms for interaction and feedback exchange. However, the peer review process, central to conference admissions, must be free from biases to ensure fairness. This study investigates affiliation biases in peer review, focusing on early-career economics conferences, where such biases are underexplored. Using a field experiment conducted during a PhD workshop, reviewers were randomly revealed or concealed researcher affiliation. Results reveal a significant affiliation bias favoring submissions from prestigious institutions, impacting acceptance rates. Notably, blind grading reduced scores for top-tier institution submissions, affecting their acceptance probabilities. Counterfactual analysis demonstrates the robustness of these findings across varying acceptance rates. The study highlights systemic biases, possibly perpetuating inequalities in academia early in researchers' careers, emphasizing the need for fair and transparent review processes.

Grades to trades to wages: Understanding the effects of graduating with honours on labour market outcomes

Abstract: Ability and future labour productivity of candidates are difficult to observe for prospective employers. As a result, they rely on signals and statistical discrimination, even though information on academic performance might not be easy to interpret. In this study, I examine the causal effect of a signal of academic ability used to identify outstanding performers. By leveraging a discontinuity in the relationship between GPA and the probability of being awarded a distinction, I quantify the signalling effect of the distinction on various labour market outcomes for recent graduates, including sector of activity and occupational characteristics such as skill and task content.
